RADOM

RADOM is a city located 100 km from Warsaw (the capital of Poland) in southern Mazovia. Radom is a poviat city with around 250,000 inhabitants. The history of the city dates back to the ninth century. Radom has always been a fairly important commercial, industrial and political center. For some time he was the "substitute capital of Poland". Currently, Radom is a growing urban center, and a great base for getting to know Poland. It is located 200 km from Krakow, 100 km from Lublin. Radom has an extensive inter-city communica- tion network. Within the city limits there is a railway station with a wide range of connections, a bus station and an airport. Radom also runs national roads No. 7 (from north to south), and national road No. 12 (east, west) as well as national road No. 9.

WARSAW

WARSAW is the capital of Poland. It is located in the Masovian Province, the largest city in Poland with 1.8 million inhabitants. It is a very well connected and modern city. There are many colleges and headquarters of companies with international reach. The city combines the modernity of European capitals with a historic climate. This connection makes it a great city for living and studying. It is one of the best communicated cities in Poland. As the only city in Poland, it has 2 metro lines. Its central location makes it a great base for getting to know Poland. It also has the largest international airport in Poland on its border.

PUBLIC HEALTH Bachelor Studies

Gain expertise in public health strategies and interventions to enhance community well-being. Prepare for diverse roles in healthcare, public policy, and non-profit organizations. In the e-learning system, 30% of materials are on-line. As part of the studies in the field of Public Health, candidates may choose one of the proposed specialties:

Bachelor degree

(undergraduate)

Management in health care

A specialty for people wishing to manage medical facilities and binding their professional career with administrative work in Health Care. This specialty prepares you for difficult and demanding work in the role of managing units such as hospitals and clinics. Trains professional managers in health care.

Organizational and Legal Aspects of Electroradiology

Electroradiology involves the use of ionizing and non-ionizing radiation for medical diagnosis and treatment. Graduates are prepared for roles in hospitals, clinics, laboratories, and other medical settings utilizing electroradiological techniques. Studies include fundamentals of electroradiology, radiation physics, equipment, medical imaging techniques, radiological protection, legal and ethical considerations, quality control, and medical unit management.

Organization in Palliative and Geriatric Care

This specialization educates individuals in managing care for elderly and terminally ill patients. Graduates acquire knowledge in aging, geriatric and palliative care, and planning social and healthcare services. They are prepared for roles in nursing homes, social care centers, public administration, NGOs, and initiatives in senior care.

Mental Health and Addiction Psychotherapy

Mental Health and Addiction Psychotherapy is a specialization within the Public Health undergraduate program, preparing students to work with individuals suffering from various mental health and addiction issues. Students acquire knowledge and skills in psychotherapy, addiction therapy, and management of prevention and treatment programs and centers.

Medical Law in Healthcare

Medical Law in Healthcare teaches students to apply and interpret legal regulations governing healthcare services and patient rights. Topics include civil and criminal liability of healthcare professionals, patient and physician rights and obligations, consent for treatment and medical examinations, medical confidentiality, documentation, organ transplantation, assisted reproduction, euthanasia, and palliative care. The specialization also covers healthcare system organization, financing (including health insurance and NFZ contracts), and quality control of healthcare services.

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Who should consider this program?

If you are interested in organizing, managing, and promoting health at individual and collective levels, the Bachelor's program in Public Health is for you. You will gain knowledge and skills to analyze and address societal health issues, plan and implement preventive and intervention measures, collaborate with various entities in the healthcare system, and monitor and evaluate the outcomes of these actions. The curriculum covers epidemiology, social medicine, medical law, bioethics, medical statistics and informatics, health psychology, health education, and social communication. Graduates can pursue careers in healthcare institutions, public administration, NGOs, schools, universities, media, and advertising agencies.

Organizing Emergency Medical Services

The elective module on organizing emergency medical services is tailored for those interested in managing institutions within this field. It enhances qualifications for roles in overseeing Poland's emergency medical services in state and local administration. Graduates are prepared for managerial positions in ambulance services and crisis communication centers, though it doesn't qualify them as emergency medical technicians. The skills acquired enable employment in uniformed services and institutions managing emergency medical services.

Organization and management in healthcare

During classes in this profile, students will familiarize themselves with the healthcare system in Poland and other European Union countries. They will develop skills in managing healthcare facilities and the personnel employed within them. Additionally, the curriculum covers topics related to finance and accounting, marketing, and financing such institutions from European Union funds and other sources. Moreover, students will acquire essential knowledge of law and learn the principles of public procurement procedures.

Sanitary and epidemiological inspection

The above module prepares students for professionally performing tasks assigned to Sanitary Inspection employees at various management levels. Students become familiar with currently applicable legal acts concerning health protection issues, with particular emphasis on regulations related to Sanitary Inspections in Poland and the European Union.

Organization in Palliative and Geriatric Care

This specialization aims to enhance skills in managing geriatric and palliative care in social institutions and healthcare settings. It's tailored for those interested in holistic aging issues and administrative roles in nursing homes, social care centers, and public administration focused on senior care.

Organizational and Legal Aspects of Electroradiology

The module on organizational and legal aspects of electroradiology targets those pursuing careers in organizing, managing, and overseeing healthcare institutions specializing in electroradiology, post undergraduate studies. It aims to enhance qualifications and knowledge for both practicing electroradiologists and those interested in electroradiology service organization. Graduates are fully prepared for managerial roles within electroradiology institutions and higher positions in governmental and local administration overseeing such facilities, addressing the need for enhanced qualifications and knowledge in this field.

Medical Law in Healthcare

Medical Law in Healthcare teaches students to apply legal regulations in healthcare and understand patient rights. Topics include civil and criminal responsibilities, patient consent, medical confidentiality, documentation, organ transplantation, assisted reproduction, euthanasia, palliative care, healthcare system organization, financing, health insurance, NFZ contracts, medical practice oversight, and quality control.
